The main aim of this report is regarding the crime activities and some of the preventive measure that can be taken to keep up the peace and harmony among the people of our country.

I have personally written a report to the Honorable President of India's office on 23rd September 2013 regarding the crime activities in Pondicherry and how to curb them and how to improvise the status of the prestigious PONDICHERRY POLICE. I received a response from the President's office on 30 September 2013 as well. (Proof Attached).

Also, when the horrible "Nirbhaya" rape incident happened, I felt so ashamed by the brutality of men involved in it. I personally contacted the Delhi Commissioner office and gave few suggestions on how to reduce the crime rate and provide protection to the citizens of Delhi in a mail to the Commissioner of Police Mr. Neeraj Kumar I.P.S (Reference No: 17782 / E-mail Dated 22/12/2012). (Proof Attached)

I received a very good feedback from the Commissioner's desk and my suggestions were well taken.

The report which I submitted to the President of INDIA was regarding the increase in crime rate and some of the preventive measures that can be taken in PONDICHERRY by the Law enforcement units to make a better way for living.

I met the D.I.G. of Pondicherry Police Mr. Shukla I.P.S and discussed all the issues that I have mentioned in report. But the discussion was unsuccessful. Few points from my report were considered by the Pondicherry Police but now they are also not effective in action.

I met many other Police officials in Pondicherry Police from Sub Inspector to D.I.G. of Police and discussed on how to reduce the crime rate in Pondicherry but none could implement what was required. No one was ready to implement any of my points from my report because I am a common man and not a big personality or a person in power whose suggestion can be adhered immediately. Though some of the low ranked police officials wanted to implement some effective measures discussed by me, they were unable to because of the fear of their higher officials.

"I am not here to disgrace the prestigious Pondicherry Police department. I just wanted to share my personal experience and my inability to implement what was required at that time".

As said earlier the main aim of this report is regarding the crime activities and some of the preventive measures that can be taken to keep up the peace and harmony among the people of our motherland. After much discussion with many officers in Pondicherry I did not want to restrict myself giving suggestion only for Pondicherry but for the whole country since my Motherland needs some consistent refinement in the mentioned aspects down the line.

Those who feel that this document is of no use please at least read from page number 18!

My Case Study - General Information:

According to the crime statistics report published by the NCRB (National Crime Records Bureau) in 2006, the highest crime rate was reported in Pondicherry (447.7%) for crimes under Indian Penal Code which is 2.7 times the national crime rate of 167.7%, Jammu Kashmir (33.7%), Manipur (33.0%), Assam (30.4%), Daman and Diu and Pondicherry (29.4%) reported higher violent crime rate compared to 18.4% at national level.

Andhra Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh are the worst states in India for women, with 32,809 and 32,546 reported incidents of crime against women, respectively, in 2013, per the National Crime Records Bureau. Nagaland, at 67 cases, is the safest state.

From the NCRB report statistics 2014, Uttar Pradesh ranks first among the states in INDIA that has registered the highest number of cases by the POLICE department with a count of 2143188 and Sikkim has the lowest number of cases registered with a count of 1135.

Among the Union Territories Delhi stand first with a count of 86800 registered cases and Lakshadweep accounts with a count of 65 registered cases.

In the year 2003 the Percentage of IPC Crimes to Total Cognizable Crimes was 31.2%.

According to the NCRB records, in the year 2013 the Percentage of IPC Crimes to Total Cognizable Crimes was 31.2%.

As per the NCRB data each year the crime rate is increasing at a higher rate.

As per the crime rate in INDIA statistics of the NCRB report 2014, the crime rate has increased abruptly to a miserable percentage.

As per the NCRB records, the total number of IPC complaints registered in the year 2014 cumulative of all the states in INDIA is – 39896132.

As per the NCRB records, the total number of IPC complaints registered in the year 2014 cumulative of all the Union Territories in INDIA is – 10171471.

The state which has the highest record is Maharashtra and the Union Territory which has the maximum record is our Capital - Delhi.

In the latest NCRB report the statistics shows Madhya Pradesh tops the cognizable crime chart released by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB).

The state has recorded a total of 2,72,423 cognizable crimes in 2014 under the Indian Penal Code (IPC), reveals the latest NCRB report, followed by Maharashtra which stood second with 2,49,834 crimes reported last year, which is 8.8 per cent of the total crimes registered in the country. Madhya Pradesh also tops the list of sexual offences under the IPC. The highest number of rape cases - 5,076 -- were reported in Madhya Pradesh followed by 3,759 in Rajasthan. In rape cases, a total of 48,193

people were arrested last year which shows a 14.4 per cent increase from the 2013 report. There is a significant increase in number of persons arrested for auto theft with the arrest of 79,680 people which shows 37.7 per cent increase from 2013.

The data of crime rates in major cities indicate Delhi tops the list as it reported the highest incidence of crimes under the IPC among the major cities in the country followed by Mumbai 40,361 incidence and Bengaluru with 31,892 last year.

The maximum 472 murder cases were reported in Delhi followed by 241 in Bengaluru. About 1,813 rape cases were registered in Delhi followed by 607 in Mumbai and 263 in Jaipur, Rajasthan. Total 5,761 rape incidents were reported in 53 mega cities.

In the cases of kidnapping and abduction, Delhi was again far ahead from other cities with 6,016 cases followed by 599 in Patna and 541 in Mumbai. Total 5,963 riots incidents were reported from 53 mega cities, including 277 communal riots incidence.

Crime against women across the country increased by around 10 per cent last year as compared to previous year with total 3, 37,922 cases registered in 2014 against 3, 09,546 cases in 2013, according to the National Crime Records Bureau's

Despite various steps taken by the Centre and state governments, crime against women across country has risen by 9.16 per cent. As per the report, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra are the least safe states for women.

In the meantime, Delhi registered 15,265 cases of crime against women in 2014 compared to 12,888 cases in 2013. The maximum number of sexual offence cases was registered in Madhya Pradesh with 15,170 cases being filed, followed by Maharashtra with 15,029 cases. In Uttar Pradesh, 12,425 cases were registered in 2014, followed by Rajasthan with 10,149 cases. West Bengal registered 9,335 cases of sexual offences, which include rape, attempt to rape and molestation.

The maximum number of rape cases in 2014 was registered in Madhya Pradesh with 5,076 incidents; followed by Rajasthan, 3,759; Uttar Pradesh, 3,467; Maharashtra, 3,438; Delhi, 2,096; West Bengal, 1,656.

The maximum number gang rapes took place in Uttar Pradesh with 573 cases being registered; followed by Rajasthan, 414 cases; Delhi, 147.

The report also stated that, in total, 58,592 cases of kidnapping of women and girls were registered in 2014, with the maximum number of cases being reported in Uttar Pradesh at 10,628; Madhya Pradesh registered 5,738 cases; West Bengal, 5062; and Bihar, 4760. A whopping 4,227 cases were registered in the national capital.

The report further pointed out that 57 cases of molestation were reported at office premises across the country and most of them were registered in Delhi and Mumbai. In total 1,19,538 cases of cruelty by husband and relatives were registered across the country.

According to the latest crime statistics report of the NCRB 2015,

Number of complaints received by Police and case Registered during 2015 in the total number of states: 18499348.

Number of complaints received by Police and case Registered during 2015 in the total number of Union Territories: 32176812.

The total number of population in INDIA as per the census 2017 is 134 cr.

Total number of registered complaints is 50676160.

If the registered complaints are more than 5 cr per year for the total number of population, it is really difficult to calculate the unregistered case! Unimaginable!

Criminals nowadays are more organized than ever before due to better communication technology and are continually adopting new techniques and modus operandi and developing new network that go beyond the national boundaries.

As per the 63rd NCRB report,

Our Capital Delhi stands first in all the crime related activities as per the report.

% Contribution of towards crime is 25.7 % of the actual population which is 163.1 lakh in %.

Rate of total cognizable crime is 1066.2 as per the population of Delhi.

Uttar Pradesh stands first in crime against women with a total of 35527 registered cases.

Delhi UT with a count of 17104 crimes against women.

Maharashtra stands first in crime against children with a count of 13921 registered cases.

Assam stands first in human trafficking and child trafficking with a total number of 1494 registered cases in the year 2015.

Again UP stands first in the crime against persons belonging to SC/ST's with a total count of 8358 registered case in the year 2015.

Rajasthan stands first in economic and corruption offences with a total count of 1555 registered cases in the year 2015.

In Recidivism UP bags the first place with a total number of arrests as per year 2015 – 500365.

Maharashtra bags the first place in Cyber Crime with a total count of 2195.

If we consider our Nation capital alone the figures are imaginary.

So cumulatively every year as per the NCRB record there is an increase in the crime rate in all types of crime.

I am not here to criticize anyone because it is in the hands of the people to change the system for their well-being.

Among the above-mentioned crimes only very few crime statistics shows that there is some reduction but even they are very minimal, this is nowhere going to reduce the huge figure as mentioned above. Our capital city Delhi stands first in all the crime criteria that have been set by the NCRB. The crime incidents against women have spiked across our country which needs to be cut down from the root. The number of rape incidents recorded by the NCRB has also increased all over the country.

We always propagand that India is our motherland which means we consider our country as our mother obviously who is a female. But the NCRB record states that the crime rate against women is very much high in INDIA ,so which automatically specifies that there is no safety and security for the women in INDIA.

We claim that the law enforcement units are responsible for keeping up the safety of the people but we have observed many lock up deaths and custodial deaths as well which gives us a feel that even there are some corrupt minds inside the law enforcement units as well.

So, we are obviously unhappy with the statistics report released by the NCRB.

My case study/document is not for those who are not concerned about the status of the society.

This is for someone who really wants to change the current scenario of the society and make the society a peaceful place for living.

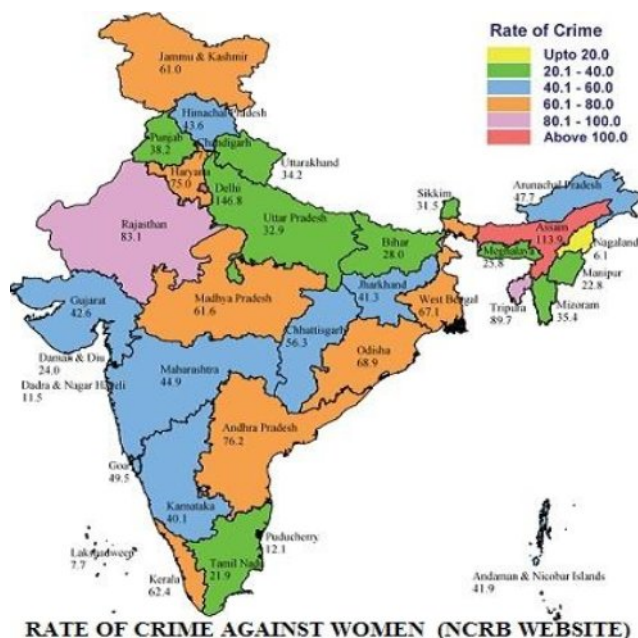
There are people who want to make a change but they are unable to do something for the betterment of the society because there are lots of obstacles in performing what they really want to do for the betterment of the society.

Let's discuss some of the crimes or in other words threats that are spoiling the current life of the people of our mother land INDIA.

Rape in India

Rape is the fourth most common crime in India. According to the National Crime Records Bureau 2013 annual report, 24,923 rape cases were reported across India in 2012. Out of these, 24,470 were committed by relative or neighbor; in other words, the victim knew the alleged rapist in 98 per cent of the cases. The incidence of reported rapes in India for 2010 was 1.8 per 100,000 people, among the lowest in the world. The US figure for 2010 was 27.3 per 100,000. However, it is estimated that only 1 in 10 rapes in India gets reported, while in the US 46% are reported.

According to 2012 statistics, New Delhi has the highest number of rape-reports among Indian cities, which is a mere shame. Several rape cases in India received widespread media attention and triggered protests since 2012. This led the Government of India to reform its penal code for crimes of rape and sexual assault.



This is one of the foremost threats that is going to impact the future in many ways.

Cyber Threat and Cyber Violence: Cyberspace is a new domain for violence and crime. This range from the use of social media to view videos showing assassinations, torture, and threats etc., Violence is going virtual, and we need to get a much better handle on all of this.

Cyber Crime:

Internet has become the primary source for an individual to convert complex task into a simple task. The excessive use of anything is harmful; the exploded adoption of the internet has also resulted into the rapid increase of Cyber Crime.

Cyber Crime is increasing at an alarming rate in INDIA. The increasing use of smart phones and tablets for online banking and other financial transactions have increased risks

The study revealed that in the past attacks have been mostly initiated from the countries such as US, Turkey, China, Brazil, Pakistan, Algeria, Turkey, Europe, Russia, Ukraine and with the growing adoption of internet and smart phone India has emerged as one of the most favorite countries among cyber criminals.

As the technology improves so as the crime and criminals!

It is a hidden terror attack for all which will exploit the peaceful life of many without the knowledge of the public and common man.

Growth of Cyber Crime Cases in India 2011 – 2016

As per the analysis Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Maharashtra have the highest number of cybercrimes registered under the new IT Act in India. These three states together contribute more than 70 per cent to India's revenue from IT and IT related industries.

Those who are arrested under these laws are young generation and the future of our Motherland. Data show that the age group of 18-30 accounts for the highest percentage of cybercrime with 1,638 persons arrested in the age bracket out of a total arrest of 3,301 in 2013.

To understand cyber threat and cyber security the common people and the administration must have a basic idea and awareness. Cyber threat is the biggest emerging threat for all.

The Internet is a global, decentralized network of computers taking advantage of common protocols permitting the transfer of information. No individual, company or government controls the Internet.

By youngsters

1. Usage of drugs:

It is becoming so popular among the youngsters. Many think that usage of drugs is a fashion; by consuming it often they become addicted to it. We can't stop it fully Sir, but we must try to minimize. Drugs like heroine, brown sugar are also becoming so popular among the teen agers.

When I had a discussion with a doctor he said that even from a medicine we can extract a harmful drug. Very minimal points of drugs are being used in few medicines. But many youngsters get these medicines only for injecting into their veins for some pleasure. We can't stop the men who get the drugs but we can effectively take actions to stop these drugs being sold out.

2. Unwanted Street fights:

Many of the youths think that creating a gang and fighting in the road sides will improve their appearance among others who watches it. No youngster is bothered about what is going to happen after the fight. This is because most of the youngster keeps a film hero in his/her mind and wants to perform all actions like the hero. Nowadays all the movies project the hero as a big don or a gang leader. So after watching these kinds of movies all the young people wants to create a gang and do all sought of heroism. No awareness is there in the minds of the young people.

3. Unwanted Street fights for girls/ fantasies:

Another important issue for the fights among the youngsters is due to having a girlfriend. Nowadays it's a fashion for all the young people to have a boyfriend or girlfriend. I have witnessed many street fights like this, even tried to stop these nuisances.

4. Drunken youngsters:

Nowadays the consumption of alcohol is also becoming so high. The young people take this as a fashion. They drink if they are happy, they drink if they are sad, and they drink for the birthday parties, funeral ceremonies, etc., so the young generation has no awareness of the future. So, after drinking they create anonymous problems like eve teasing, riding bikes very fast and harsh, sexual harassments etc.

5. Eve teasing

Eve-teasing is a term used in India for public sexual harassment or molestation (often known as "street harassment") of women by men, where Eve alludes to the very first woman, according to the Biblical creation story. Eve teasing usually occurs in public spaces, streets, and public transport. Some feminist writers claim that this behavior is a kind of "little rape". Some guidebooks to the some parts warn female tourists to avoid attracting the attention of these kinds of men by wearing conservative clothing. However, this harassment is reported both by Indian women and by conservatively dressed foreign women.

By aged men

Sexual Harassment:

Sexual harassment is most often done by many aged men. They drink much and create this type of social crimes in recreational places, buses etc., I have witnessed many incidents like this even when I go out with my own family members. I have even warned such people at times when I was in my school days.

Bullying

This is one type of threat to the people. A bully is a dominating person or group of persons who abuse others. A person who tries to control others by fear or a person who behaves in an aggressive, thoughtless and unjust manner to others. Bullying impacts everyone in different ways. In some cases, victims could not bear the ridicule and taunting and have committed suicide.

Elder People Abuse

The abuse of elderly persons is a growing concern in the present scenario. Vulnerable senior persons are targeted most of time in most of places. The elderly and the vulnerable people hesitate to report their sufferings too for a variety of reasons.

Vulnerable Person: means any adult who by nature of a physical, emotional or psychological condition is dependent on other persons for care and assistance in day to day living.

This information will not stop crime, but following these guidelines will reduce the chance of a crime being committed against you.

Personal safety is the responsibility of each of us, as well as your community.

Robbery/Theft

Robbery/Theft is a crime that targets both people and businesses. Reduce the risk of personal injury and increase the potential of bringing the culprit(s) to justice.

Treat violence or threat as a public health concern, because the term in real will spoil the healthy living of people in the current environment.

There are lots of social tensions in our society, which are like computer viruses which could spread easily and infect the administrative system.

There are lots of divergent views in describing the causes of crime and on how to prevent them.

CAUSES OF CRIME by Henry Thomas Buckle:

“The society prepares the crime,

- ➔ 1.Establish manageable enforcing units
- ➔ 2.Assign quality managers and grant them genuine authority
- ➔ 3.Reform Crime reporting and crime analysis
- ➔ 4.Develop effective local crime investigation
- ➔ 5.Establish effective oversight systems
- ➔ 6.Build a career path for rank and field officers
- ➔ 7.Develop explicit use of force policies to control police violence
- ➔ 8. Reform Criminal Justice System.

Reasons for Crime from my point of view:

1. The one who commits a crime is very sure that he is back upped with a strong Political support or a very good family background. They have confidence that even if they commit a crime they can easily come out of the criminal act. So, they don't fear to commit a Crime.
2. The young generation who commits the crime doesn't fear the police or neither their future. This is due to the movies which depicts and degrades the police officers. The movies show police men as a money getting machine. So, after seeing the movie normally everyone gets a bad opinion about the police department which makes criminals to commit crime anywhere and anytime.
3. The criminals are ready to face the Police too. They don't fear the POLICE and the crime rate is apparently increasing. It's not that we must blame the movies but we must prove to be efficient and not like the ones who are been depicted in the movies. It will happen only when we stay in the hearts of the public as an efficient Police officer.

4. It is obvious that if we arrest a criminal who does a crime easily gets out of the crime within few hours. As shown in much of the movies, in many cases we arrest some criminal and within few minutes we get a call from a politician or some higher official to release him. So, the criminal or the bully is also ready to challenge the POLICE personal.

5. Poor Parenting, it is one the main reason for a crime to happen by the youngsters. If we check any crime statistics report, we can find most of the crimes are caused by juvenile. Which clearly means that the juvenile or the young generation does not have the awareness of the after effect of committing a crime. So first they are tempted to do a crime and later they will regret.

6. Un Employment, this is also one of the most important factors that need to be considered. No work obviously makes people to think in all different ways, more often negative ways. There is no awareness of the growth of the country as well as they are not sure of what is their future.

“Crime came before laws”

“Laws were created to prevent crime by setting boundaries and creating consequences if those boundaries are crossed!”

Lots of ways to represent crime but all the sentence has the same meaning...

Crime Triangle:

A fire needs oxygen, heat, and fuel to get ignited which is called as the fire triangle. The below image depicts the crime triangle.



From the above picture, we can observe that if crime will occur opportunity to commit a crime, desire to commit a crime and the ability to do a crime matters a lot for a criminal to commit a crime.

There is another way to represent how a crime can occur:



Criminal:

The person who is going to commit the crime

Victim:

The person who got affected by the incident

Opportunity:

This provokes the criminal to commit the crime at the right time.

So, from the above pictorial representation we are clear that if a crime will occur in any instance all these three terminologies will be matched.

All these three elements must be present for a crime to occur.

During the time of crime investigation, the crime triangle as shown above can be used by the POLICE department.

Usually the Police department will have their own strategy to solve any sought of crime incident.

It depends on the investigating officer as well.

In general a common man is very much panic about few issues as listed below which is very common in most of the cities and most of the villages and most commonly everywhere all over the country and in top of it may be all over the world. The below mentioned criminal acts are dangerous.

4. Bomb-threat
- 5.Katta panchayat
6. Rowdies
7. Robbery
8. Threats by rowdies

*** In the present scenario, most of the crimes are committed by rogues***

First the police must know the difference between Rogue and Rowdy.

Rogue

No principals, unreliable, - Rough disorderly person
scoundrel, rascal.

Each end every public salutes a rowdy because of fear, but each and every public fears for a rouge. (It happens and it had happened in many instances).

It is very dangerous to allow a rouge to become a rowdy.

Both rowdies and rogue are like computer virus that they will spread their fascination to the followers of them.

Rowdy

SOME OF THE STEPS THAT CAN BE TAKEN FOR EFFECTIVE POLICING AND TO REDUCE CRIME RATE:

MONITORING PEOPLE GATHERING AREAS:

1. CCTV cameras must be fixed in public gathering areas like bus stand, railway station, in front of Schools, colleges, temple premises, malls, markets, bazaar etc.
2. Deploy police personal in 24/7 support to monitor the CCTV cameras.
3. Each of the POLICE unit monitoring the 24/7 CCTV support must be coordinating or must be Connected with the patrol police in the areas.
4. 24/7 support of effective Policing must be provided.

USE:

1. We can review the CCTV footage when and where required.
2. Investigation of any crime scene can be made easy for the POLICE department.

POINT OF CONTACT-Displaying the contact numbers

1. Instead of displaying “For Emergency Contact – 100”, display the contact number of the locality or nearby Police SHO’s mobile number in all public gathering places.
2. Everyone, can be a college going individual or an employee residing in a locality must be aware of their local POLICE SHO’s contact number.
3. Even people who are not employed like house wife, elderly persons must have a note of their localities POLICE SHO’s number.
4. All the States and Union Territories have their individual POLICE department websites where they have given all the contact numbers, but in case of any emergency none is going to switch on their internet connection to browse and get the detail of their nearest Police station or the POLICE SHO’s number, which is practically impossible.
5. The contact numbers of the POLICE station or the POLICE station SHO can be furnished in

all the Educational institution's notice board, all the government and private sector office for easy access.

6. The contact numbers can be furnished in flats and apartments too for easy access of the Nearest POLICE station.

7. Display the contact numbers of the POLICE station or the POLICE stations SHO in the entire public mode of transport like buses, auto, taxi that runs between one point to another.

USE:

Displaying the contact number of the local police station or the POLICE SHO in a public mode of transport will help the public and POLICE in many ways, like:

1. If a crime (eve teasing, sexual harassment, robbery. etc.,) happens in a bus and if the bus transits from one point to another at least one person in the bus can call to the police station which lies in between the two points or the SHO who is in charge and inform the crime scene so that within few minutes POLICE can reach the spot and keep the situation in control.

2. The above point is considering two points that lies between very few kms.

3. If in case of a long-distance journey, the POLICE patrol emergency contact number must be displayed.

So, that, at least POLICE personal will have some information and even if they are not able to reach the spot in time they can arrange some other alternatives, like they can spot the vehicle and inform the Police station that lies near to the vehicle spot.

USE:

There will be a prompt action by the POLICE department before the public mode of transport reaches its destination.

Some other steps that can be taken for the betterment of the society:

1. Proper plan of action and execution is always needed.
2. In an area form group of senior citizens or a group of retired persons with a SPOC (Single point of contact) to gather information about suspicious persons or suspicious happenings of their area or street. The respective station officer in charge of the area can collect the details from those groups every week or month and take necessary actions on those track records.

3. A policeman can't be everywhere at all the times so forming groups and gathering information from the groups will be much helpful for reducing crime and can keep a track record of the suspected people and suspicious activities.
4. Gather information and views from the public on how to reduce traffic, crime rate and how to improve the status of POLICE or what exactly the people want from the POLICE.
5. All the local police stations must maintain a record of the residents of the area which will be very much useful in the time of investigation.
6. In each country for every issue first person to be called is the POLICE Department, because they will guide us what to do next. So, make POLICE as easy accessible to the public for sure the public will be threat free.
7. Combat trainings must be given to the state POLICE, at least they must know how to tackle a person with a pocket knife.
8. Insist all the shops, hotels, bakery to keep minimal cost CCTV cams for their safety. They must have a backup of at least 30 days.
9. To avoid theft and robbery get the list of workers who come into an area to do some privatized work like masonry, building works drilling etc.
10. Get the youth or unemployed involve in night patrols or community patrol in every area.
11. During weekends the patrol rounds must be very strict in hotspots.
12. Take a note of all those who appear in banners, cut outs and maintain a record in all the circle Police Stations.
13. Lodges and mansions must be checked at times by enforcement authorities.
14. All the route buses must display the local police station's number and the station officer's Numbers to avoid eve teasing, chain snatching etc.
15. Display the numbers of the nearest police station and the station officer's number in cinema Theatres and recreational places and the places where public gather in numbers.
16. Internet centers must be advised to block few websites those create harm to the public like making of bombs etc. When we can block porn sites we can do this as well.
17. Bus stands, railway stations must be patrolled heavily.
18. Use of complaint boxes every two to four kilometers in all the areas so that the person who wishes to launch a complaint but afraid to expose himself can drop his complaint in the complaint box. If regular action is taken for the complaints dropped in the complaint box for sure, the public will get confidence on the prestigious police department.
19. Easy access of Police patrolling vehicles.
20. The load man contractors should be watched out carefully.
21. Awareness programs for the youth who are un employed.
22. Avoid displaying the CCTV cameras in television and news channels those are kept for monitoring robbery and snatching during the festival times. Because we are keeping those cameras to trap criminals but we our self-show them where the cameras are being fixed.
23. Pubs and bars must be monitored very strictly.
24. Traffics signals are not maintained properly so maintain and keep them under surveillance.
25. Illegal sales of drinks must be stopped.
26. Information must be gathered about the tenants in each area by the local police Stations. The tenants must provide their identity to the nearest Police station.
27. Theatres and Malls must be equipped with private security guards. Insist the theatre owners and Mall owners to recruit securities and train them with some basic self-defense Techniques.
28. Frequent station visit by the senior officials must be made mandatory.

29. Bar's in critical areas must be cleared or closed by 10.00 p.m.
30. Incentives and awards can be given to all those who go for night rounds and those who go for Rounds in critical areas as well.
31. Every policeman must act if any crime happens beyond their jurisdiction also.
32. Gather the innovative ideas from the POLICE personal itself, because as a common responsible citizen, if can suggest so many points to reduce crime rate and traffic congestion for sure there will be more energetic POLICE officials who really want to make some difference.
33. Predictive policing refers to the usage of predictive and analytical techniques in law enforcement to identify potential criminal activity. Predictive policing methods fall into four general categories: methods for predicting crimes, methods for predicting offenders, methods for predicting perpetrators' identities, and methods for predicting victims of crime.
34. Make use young and energetic police officers at filed work. Move senior or aged officers to administration work.
35. Arrange martial arts or self- defense classes for the POLICE officials because there might be times when the Policemen must fight with bare hands.
36. POLICE is not just a government job; make each POLICE officer to fix this in mind.
37. A Police man or a Police officer must always have the urge to do something for the people. He must have the feel that we live for the people and we die for the people, So motivate them.
38. Physical as well as mental health of each POLICE man must be maintained through some yoga programs. Make it mandatory
39. Please advise parents to make a small piece of note mentioning their contact numbers somewhere may be in the kids bag or school box (for kids) a small note or a diary so that even when they are lost (not kidnapped) people can easily find the whereabouts by contacting the number. It will be good enough if we can insist the parents to include their contact address too in the note.
40. Make it mandatory that schools or day-care centers must collect the information of the person to whom the child may be released after school hours, and inform them whom to notify if the child does not arrive to the school.
41. Consider advising a self-defense course that teaches awareness, avoidance and action.
42. Make things online like if a person who is not from the specified location but wants to launch complaint he can approach the nearest police station and register. So, the Police personal can track the complaint and can transfer the same to the concerned police station or the concerned police officer through email.
43. Use proper reflectors and sign boards in the hotspots so that it can be used proactively by the night riders and drivers.
44. Police can use social media for awareness regarding the crime activities and prevention methods. Through social media we can bring awareness to civilians on how to join the law enforcement forces.
45. Emergency response training can be given to even the civilians and security guards who are deployed in apartments and gated communities.
46. Advice civilians while recruiting private securities. Insist them to recruit securities from well-known private agencies which are registered to the government.
47. Multiple language training can be given to the state Police officials so that they will be able

to handle if the case is transferred to some other district. Cross training must be made possible with interstate police.

48. Instead of tracking records in paper files make it electronic. It will be easy to preserve and as well secured.

49. When a person is in distress and if he/she is not able to communicate to anyone for help a high severity number can be provided to the public so that if a person is in any trouble even if a missed call is given to that number the police must start tracing the number using GPS tracking system.

50. Make use of police personal and civilians who are most interested in doing field work in monitoring any part of the state or even the country.

P- POLITENESS

I- INTEGRITY

C- COURTESY

E- ENDURANCE

In this regard, it is to inform that the matter regarding usages of drugs referred to at page 11 is general in nature and further drug law enforcement agencies including Narcotics Control Bureau are taking a lot of steps to curb the drug menace in form of supply reduction, demand reduction and harm reduction. In this regard, further details may be sought from Department of Revenue and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. It is also informed that as reported to Narcotics Control Bureau, during the year 2015 and 2016 (upto October, 2016), various drug law enforcement agencies have arrested 32,568 and 19,391 persons in 27,249 and 16,141 cases respectively and a huge amount of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances have been seized.

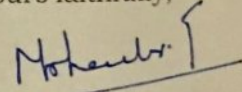
